# Map of Circular Quay

## >>> Gradients

Gradient warnings are indicated on the map. The arrows indicate the downhill grade. Warnings are provided for streets with an inclination of 1:14 or steeper.

## — Kerb Ramps

City of Sydney has collated information on gradients for all kerb ramps in the CBD area. Those in the detailed map of Circular Quay have been plotted. The kerb ramps you see on this map marked in **brown colour** will be **difficult to negotiate** without assistance. The ramps in **blue** should be **easily negotiated**.

## ☎ Telephones

The telephones plotted on this map are either TTY phones or those inside bus shelters.

## ♿ Automatic Public Toilets

These toilets are fully accessible. Audio and visual instructions are provided in the toilets. **Usage is limited to 20 minutes** and is controlled by an alarm. This alarm is accompanied by a flashing light to let the user know that the door will be opening in a few seconds. These toilets are brightly lit and secure and are **open 6am to 12 midnight**. The toilet bowl and floor are cleaned, disinfected and dried automatically after use.

## 🏧 Automatic Teller Machines (ATM)

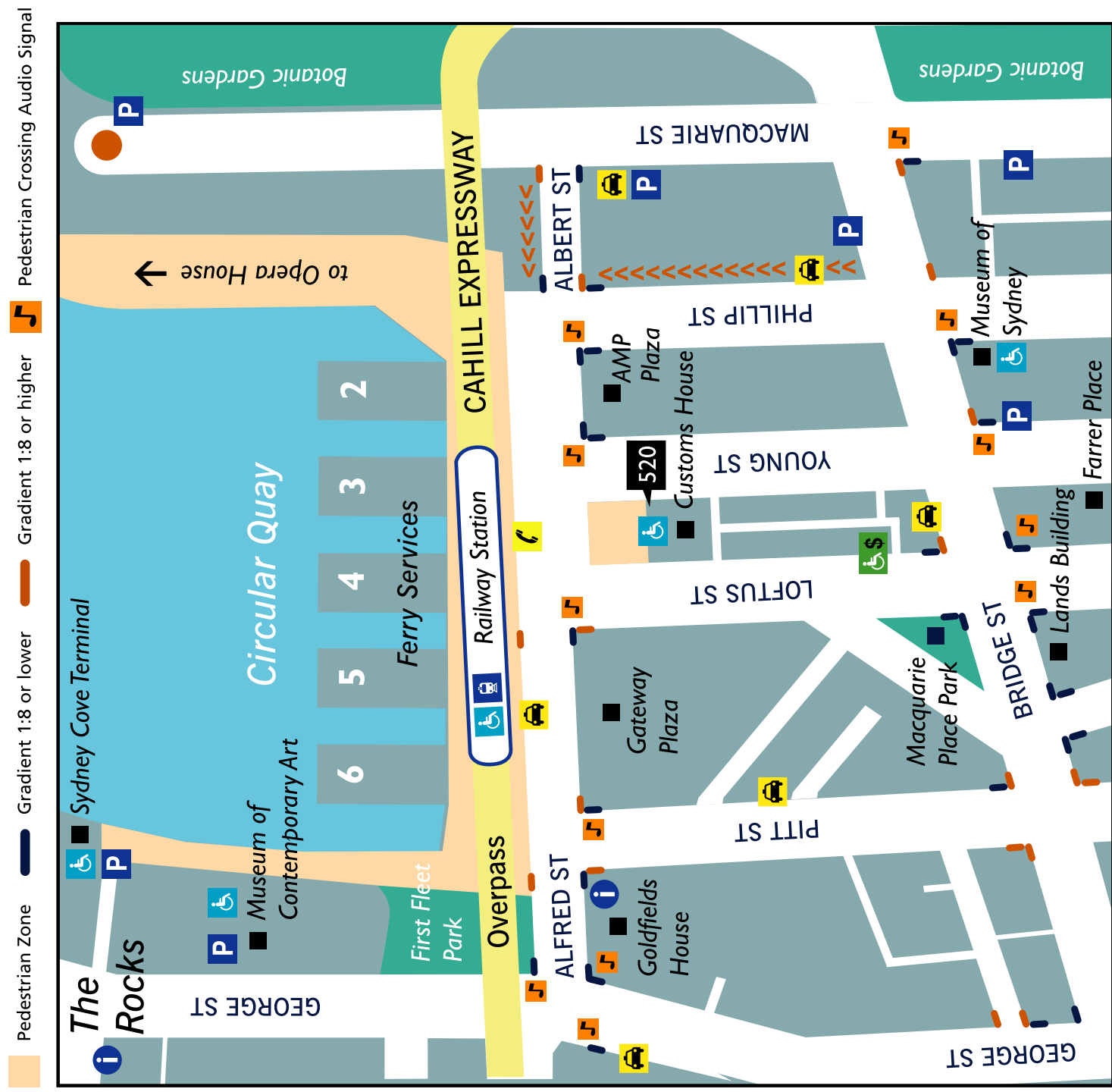
The ATMs plotted on this map have been lowered to enable people with disabilities to access them from a wheelchair. All ATMs have visual text prompts as well as written instructions posted nearby.

## 🎵 Audio Crossing Signals

Many crossings in the Sydney CBD are fitted with audio cues at traffic lights. The detailed map of the Circular Quay area shows where the audio crossing signals are.

## Tactile Street Signage

Additional Tactile Streetname plates are being progressively installed on traffic light poles throughout the CBD. Information on streetname and building numbers is provided in Braille next to the traffic light push-button to assist visually impaired people to navigate to various street destinations.

## Buses

Accessible Sydney buses will display the international wheelchair symbol. Ramps are extended and the suspension is lowered to help you board. Priority seating and spaces are made available. Accessible buses are fitted with brighter handrails and better lighting and have wider doors. There are accessible bells as well as an emergency alarm if you require assistance from the driver or other travellers. **Accessible bus stops around the city have been plotted on this map.** As all buses are not accessible, intending passengers should contact the Transport Infoline to check which services are accessible.

## --○-- Monorail

The monorail operates everyday running every 3-5 minutes linking the city to Darling Harbour and providing easy access to other tourist attractions like the Entertainment Centre and Powerhouse Museum. **All monorail trains are accessible** and carriages are equipped with ample space to accommodate wheelchairs and other mobility aids. Good access to all stations is in place. Tickets can be purchased at all stations and the trains run till late.

## Taxis

Taxis can be hailed from the street or engaged at designated taxi ranks. Secure ranks (operating on Friday and Saturday nights) are plotted on this map along with the locations of fixed ranks. Supervision operates Friday night until 5:00am and Saturday night until 2:00am. Under the Taxi Transport subsidy scheme people with a disability can get a subsidy. Taxis are designed for people with fixed wheelchairs. Kerb ramps have been provided at 10 key taxi ranks to assist access into rear loading taxis.

## \* Trains

CityRail is currently developing a network of **Easy Access Stations** featuring lifts, ramps and hearing loops at booking offices to make communication easier. Those stations featuring all or some of those access facilities are denoted with a special symbol which is a train with a star beside it. The brochure **Welcome to CityRail** lists the facilities at all stations.
