### ITEM 10.2

#### CHINATOWN IMPROVEMENTS: CHINATOWN PUBLIC DOMAIN STUDY

(S046660)

It is resolved that:

- (A) Council receive and note the draft Chinatown Public Domain Study, shown at Attachment A to the subject report, and request that the following amendments be made to the Study:
- (i) the inclusion of the following overarching strategic objective:

“To respect, protect and build on the area’s historic links with Chinese culture and the Chinese community, together with the growing influence of other Asian cultures and communities, while recognising the area’s importance to contributing to the vitality and diversity of Sydney as a global City.”
  - (ii) the replacement of Project 2.1.1 with the following:

“Maximise opportunities for public art which celebrate Chinatown’s traditional and contemporary characteristics by involving Chinese, other Asian and local artists.”;
- (B) the City engage with key stakeholders of the Chinatown area on the draft Chinatown Public Domain Study to test the study objectives and determine implementation priorities;
- (C) the City begin preliminary work to implement two of the Study’s actions already noted through the City’s Local Action Plans:
- Action 4.1: Improve pedestrian priority and accessibility; and
  - Action 4.3: Improve quality of streets; and

- (D) a report be brought back to Council incorporating a final Chinatown Public Domain Study that includes the results of stakeholder consultation and a project implementation plan (including budgets and likely costs).
- (E) Council note the representations of the Sydney Korean Business Association and the developing Korean business community centred around World Square and congratulate them on their business and community campaigns on littering called “Clean Sydney Campaign”, and Council support their request for the occasional display of two pole banners in appropriate locations in this area.

The motion was carried unanimously.
